Its mission is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in His name without discrimination.



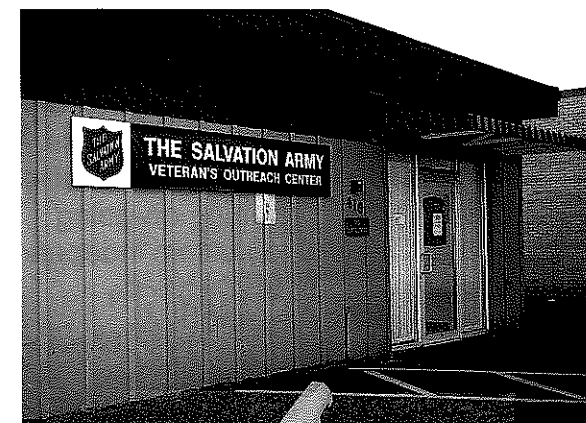

## Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF)

The Salvation Army provides financial and support services to Veterans and Veteran Families through the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) Program.

SSVF is a housing stability-focused service delivery program for very low-income veteran families throughout Central Illinois. This program will serve veteran families that are homeless or imminently at-risk of being homeless.

The goal is to stabilize these families in housing, while providing on-going support as needed to sustain independent living.

### You May Qualify If...

1. You or your spouse are a Veteran
2. You have a very low income that does not exceed 50% of area median income
3. Your housing status is in one of the following three categories:
  - You reside in housing and lack the ability to pay all of your bills
  - You are currently homeless
  - You have left permanent housing within the past 90 days to seek other housing that better meets your family's needs or preferences

- Assistance in Obtaining Public Benefits
- Assistance in Securing Permanent Housing
- Rental Deposits
- Utility Deposits
- Time & Amount Limited Rental Assistance

- Amount Limited Moving Costs
- Amount Limited Emergency Supplies
- Transportation Assistance
- Information and Referrals to other Community Resources

## What to Bring To Your Intake Meeting at The Salvation Army:

- Your DD214 with discharge status showing on the form
- VA ID card
- Driver's license or state ID (for all adults in the household)
- Social Security card (for all adults and children in the household)
- Verification of income (for all adults and children in the household)
- Lease (if you have housing—must be signed by the landlord & the veteran)
- If applicable, a letter from the landlord stating the amount of rent arrears—signed & dated, with phone number & address of landlord on the letter
- If applicable, eviction notice or notice to vacate, or a letter from person with whom you are staying that states you must leave
- If applicable, copy of utilities that you need considered for payment
